## Here is what tax-free income can mean to you!

To see how beneficial a tax-free rate of return can be to you, check the chart below. The chart shows what a taxable investment would have to yield to match a tax-free investment.

Aquila Tax-Free Fund For Utah is a mutual fund which seeks to provide as high a level of current income, exempt from both state of Utah and federal income taxes, as is consistent with preservation of capital.<sup>1</sup> To achieve this objective, the Fund invests primarily in tax-free municipal obligations of Utah issuers; securities that finance schools, highways, hospitals, water and sewer facilities, and other projects in Utah. These obligations can be of any maturity, but the Fund's weighted average maturity has traditionally been between 5- and 15-years.
